

MASTER OF THEOLOGICAL STUDIES (MATS) PROGRESS CHECKLIST

You need a total of 48 semester units, including at least one upper level course (numbered 4000 or above) or a special reading course in which you write a substantial paper. Three courses are to be taken in each of the three areas of the SFTS curriculum (a total of 9 full courses); the remaining seven courses may be chosen to create an emphasis in a particular field or to acquire broad familiarity with theological studies.

Although there are no core course requirements for the MATS degree, unless you have a solid background in Biblical and theological studies, you are encouraged to take the core courses in the M.Div. curriculum to satisfy your distribution requirements.
